- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) Before an organization listed in subsection (b) of this section may conduct
 a gaming event, the organization shall obtain a permit from the county agency that
 the county commissioners designate.

1 the proceeds from more than [one gaming event] FOUR GAMING EVENTS in which the 2 major prize has a value of more than \$5,000.

3 (3) During each calendar year, the holder of a gaming event may hold 4 one raffle in which prize drawings are held on more than a single day if the major 5 prize has a value of \$5,000 or less.

6 (4) The county commissioners may regulate the number of permits to 7 conduct a raffle that an organization may receive in 1 calendar year.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2014.
