1 AN ACT concerning

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## Teaching Fellows for Maryland Scholarship Program

FOR the purpose of renaming the Maryland Teacher Scholarship to be the Teaching Fellows for Maryland scholarship and altering certain elements of the scholarship program; requiring certain institutions of higher education to provide certain matching funds to participate in a certain program; altering the eligibility criteria and the service obligation for the scholarship; authorizing certain recipients to work in certain public schools and certain public prekindergarten programs to satisfy a certain service obligation under certain circumstances; altering the amount of a certain award; requiring certain institutions of higher education to develop and implement a certain honors program in response to certain dedication and accomplishment under certain circumstances; requiring the Governor annually to include certain funds in the State budget for the Maryland Higher Education Commission to make certain
