## 2 Teachers and Principals - Performance Evaluation Criteria - Use of Student 3 **Growth Data**

- FOR the purpose of renaming certain model performance evaluation criteria; 4 5 prohibiting certain performance evaluation criteria from requiring the use of 6 certain student growth data before a certain year; prohibiting a county board of 7 education from being required to adopt certain model performance evaluation eriteria providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the 8 9 use of student growth data in performance evaluation criteria.
