#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights – Prosecutorial Disclosures – Punitive Action

FOR the purpose of prohibiting punitive action from being taken against a law 4  $\mathbf{5}$ enforcement officer based solely on the fact that a prosecutorial agency 6 determined that it must disclose information about the law enforcement officer 7 to the defense under certain circumstances; specifying that this Act does not 8 limit a law enforcement agency from taking punitive action against a law enforcement officer based on the underlying acts or omissions for which 9 information about the law enforcement officer was disclosed; providing for the 10 construction of this Act; and generally relating to prosecutorial disclosures and 11 12the Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights.

(A) BASED SOLELY ON THE FACT THAT A PROSECUTORIAL AGENCY HAS
DETERMINED THAT IT SHALL DISCLOSE INFORMATION ABOUT A LAW
ENFORCEMENT OFFICER TO THE DEFENSE IN ACCORDANCE WITH MARYLAND
RULES 4-262(D) OR 4-263(D), THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER MAY NOT:
