A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Medical Assistance Program – Services for Children With Down**
3 **Syndrome**
4 **(Micah’s Law)**

5 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to apply
6 to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services for a certain waiver in order
7 to receive federal matching funds for certain services to certain children with
8 Down syndrome; and generally relating to the Medical Assistance Program and
9 a waiver for services for children with Down syndrome.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Health – General**

18 15–130.

19 (a) In this section, “seriously emotionally disturbed” means a condition that
20 is:

21 (1) Manifest in an individual younger than 18 years or, if the
22 individual is in a residential treatment center, younger than 21 years;

1 (2) Diagnosed according to the current diagnostic classification system
2 that is recognized by the Secretary; and

3 (3) Characterized by a functional impairment that substantially
4 interferes with or limits the child's role or functioning in the family, school, or
5 community activities.

6 (b) (1) The Department shall apply to the Health Care Financing
7 Administration of the federal Department of Health and Human Services for a
8 home- and community-based services waiver under § 1915(c) of the federal Social
9 Security Act in order to receive federal matching funds for services to seriously
10 emotionally disturbed individuals who would otherwise require institutionalization in
11 a residential treatment center.

12 (2) The Department shall apply to the Health Care Financing
13 Administration of the federal Department of Health and Human Services for a
14 home- and community-based services waiver under § 1915(c) of the federal Social
15 Security Act in order to receive federal matching funds for services to autistic children
16 aged 1 through 21 years who would otherwise require institutionalization in an
17 institution for the developmentally disabled.

18 **(3) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL APPLY TO THE CENTERS FOR**
19 **MEDICARE AND MEDICAID SERVICES FOR A HOME- AND COMMUNITY-BASED**
20 **SERVICES WAIVER UNDER § 1915(C) OF THE FEDERAL SOCIAL SECURITY ACT IN**
21 **ORDER TO RECEIVE FEDERAL MATCHING FUNDS FOR SERVICES TO CHILDREN**
22 **WITH DOWN SYNDROME WHO ARE UNDER THE AGE OF 22 YEARS AND WHO MEET**
23 **AN INSTITUTIONAL CARE FACILITY FOR THE DEVELOPMENTALLY DISABLED, A**
24 **HOSPITAL, OR A NURSING HOME LEVEL OF CARE.**

25 (c) In accordance with subsection (b)(1) [and], (2), AND **(3)** of this section,
26 the services to be provided for seriously emotionally disturbed individuals [or],
27 autistic children, **OR CHILDREN WITH DOWN SYNDROME** may include, but are not
28 limited to:

29 (1) Respite services;

30 (2) Family training and education;

31 (3) Day treatment services;

32 (4) Therapeutic integration services;

33 (5) Intensive individual support services;

34 (6) Therapeutic living services;

1 (7) Intensive in-home intervention services; and

2 (8) Specialized case management services.

3 (d) The State matching funds required to cover the Medicaid costs under the
4 waiver for autistic children shall be certified or otherwise provided by the Maryland
5 State Department of Education, local school systems, and local lead agencies.

6 (e) The State matching funds required to cover the Medicaid costs under the
7 waiver for seriously emotionally disturbed individuals shall be certified or otherwise
8 provided by the Maryland State Department of Education, local school systems, local
9 lead agencies, and the Mental Hygiene Administration.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 July 1, 2014.
