[6-420.17 18 The purposes of the Program are to provide facilities or programs that offer and 19 provide: 20 (1) crisis and transition shelter, proper nutrition, and adequate services to homeless individuals and families, which may include linkage to multiple 2122 service components, centralized decision making regarding placement, case 23 management, transportation, and follow-up services; and 24(2)services to prevent individuals and families in a housing crisis 25from becoming homeless.
