A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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District Court of Maryland Employees - Collective Bargaining

FOR the purpose of establishing collective bargaining rights for certain employees of the District Court of Maryland; establishing the State Judicial Employees Labor Relations Board as an independent unit of State government; providing for the composition, chair, staffing, powers, and duties of the Board; providing for the staggering of terms of the members of the Board; requiring the Board to appoint an Executive Director of the Board; specifying the powers and duties of the Executive Director; requiring the Board to recognize one statewide bargaining unit; requiring the Board to adopt certain regulations related to the establishment of a certain bargaining unit and the designation of an exclusive representative; requiring the Board to conduct certain investigations; authorizing the Board to hold certain hearings under certain circumstances; authorizing certain persons to petition a certain court for a certain purpose; applying certain provisions of law to certain employees, the District Court of Maryland, the Chief Judge of the District Court, the Administrative Office of the Courts, and the exclusive representative for certain employees; providing for the duties of a certain exclusive representative; requiring the District Court of Maryland and an employee organization to negotiate in a certain manner under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to conduct a certain hearing or authorize a certain arbitrator to conduct a hearing for a certain purpose under certain circumstances; requiring collective bargaining to include certain matters; authorizing collective bargaining to include negotiations relating to service fees; providing that negotiations shall conclude with a memorandum of understanding that covers certain matters; providing that a memorandum of understanding is not valid under certain circumstances; providing for the ratification of a memorandum of understanding; defining a certain term; specifying the terms of the initial members of the Board; and generally relating to collective bargaining for employees of the District Court of Maryland.
