### A BILL ENTITLED

#### State–Owned Airport Concessionaire Employees – Payment of Wages and Other Rights

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain employers operating food, beverage, or retail  $\mathbf{5}$ operations within certain airports to pay a certain wage to certain employees; 6 requiring a certain wage to increase by a certain amount under certain 7 circumstances; requiring the Maryland Aviation Administration to determine a 8 certain wage by a certain date and post certain information on its Web site; 9 providing that certain parties that dispute a certain wage determination may appeal the determination to the Commissioner of Labor and Industry; requiring 10 the Commissioner to issue a certain final administrative determination; 11 12requiring the Administration to post a certain decision by a certain date; 13 requiring the payment of a certain wage supplement or a certain wage to certain employees under certain circumstances; requiring the Administration to 14reimburse certain employers under certain circumstances; requiring the 1516 Administration to terminate a certain lease by a certain date under certain 17circumstances; providing for the requirements of certain leases; requiring the Commissioner to enforce certain provisions of this Act in a certain manner; 18 authorizing certain employees to bring an action for a violation of certain 1920provisions of this Act under certain circumstances; authorizing the 21 Commissioner to adopt certain regulations; prohibiting certain actions against 22certain employees; providing for the construction of certain provisions of this 23Act; making the provisions of this Act severable; providing for the application of 24this Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the rights of 25employees employed by concessionaires of State-owned airports.

1 (A) (1) BEGINNING NOVEMBER 1, 2014, EACH EMPLOYER SHALL PAY 2 ITS EMPLOYEES A WAGE EQUAL TO AT LEAST THE AVERAGE WAGE DETERMINED 3 AND POSTED BY THE ADMINISTRATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (B) 4 OF THIS SECTION.

5 (2) IF DURING THE 12-MONTH PERIOD FOLLOWING THE
6 DETERMINATION AND POSTING OF THE AVERAGE WAGE UNDER SUBSECTION (B)
7 OF THIS SECTION THE AVERAGE WAGE INCREASES, BY THE NEXT NOVEMBER 1,
8 THE REQUIRED WAGE SHALL INCREASE BY AN EQUAL AMOUNT.

9 (B) (1) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE 10 ADMINISTRATION SHALL:

11(I) DETERMINE THE AVERAGE WAGE PAID BY THE12ADMINISTRATION TO EMPLOYEES IN THE ADMINISTRATION'S LOWEST PAID JOB13CLASSIFICATION; AND

14(II) POST THE AVERAGE WAGE AND SUPPORTING DATA ON15THE ADMINISTRATION'S WEB SITE.

16 (2) A PARTY THAT DISPUTES THE WAGE DETERMINATION **(I)** 17PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY THE UNDER APPEAL DETERMINATION TO THE COMMISSIONER. 18

19(II) AFTER REVIEW BY THE COMMISSIONER, THE20COMMISSIONER SHALL ISSUE A FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DETERMINATION.

21 (3) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE 22 ADMINISTRATION SHALL POST ITS DECISION TO PAY WAGE SUPPLEMENTS 23 UNDER § 5–1404(1) OF THIS SUBTITLE.

IF, DURING ANY PERIOD BEFORE TERMINATION OF A LEASE UNDER § 5–1405 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE EMPLOYER SUBJECT TO THE LEASE FAILS TO PAY THE WAGE REQUIRED UNDER § 5–1403 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL:

(1) PAY A WAGE SUPPLEMENT TO EACH EMPLOYEE TO INCREASE
 THE EMPLOYEE'S WAGE TO THE AVERAGE WAGE REQUIRED UNDER § 5–1403(A)
 OF THIS SUBTITLE; OR

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1 (2) (I) REQUIRE THE EMPLOYER TO PAY THE WAGE 2 SUPPLEMENTS DESCRIBED IN ITEM (1) OF THIS SECTION; AND

3 (II) REIMBURSE THE EMPLOYER FOR THE WAGE 4 SUPPLEMENTS PAID.

6 (A) ON APRIL 1, 2017, IF THE ADMINISTRATION IS PAYING A WAGE 7 SUPPLEMENT OR REIMBURSING AN EMPLOYER UNDER § 5–1404 OF THIS 8 SUBTITLE, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL TERMINATE ITS LEASE WITH 9 AIRMALL USA BY OCTOBER 21, 2017, AS PERMITTED IN ARTICLE III, TERM 10 SECTION C, SUPPLEMENT NO. 2 TO LEASE AND CONCESSIONS CONTRACT NO. 11 MAA-LC-04-001.

12 (B) ANY SUBSEQUENT CONCESSIONS LEASE ENTERED INTO BY THE 13 ADMINISTRATION SHALL REQUIRE THAT EMPLOYERS PAY WAGES THAT COMPLY 14 WITH § 5–1403 OF THIS SUBTITLE AND DO NOT REQUIRE THE ADMINISTRATION 15 TO PAY WAGE SUPPLEMENTS OR REIMBURSE AN EMPLOYER UNDER § 5–1404 OF 16 THIS SUBTITLE.

(B) AN EMPLOYEE HAS A RIGHT OF ACTION FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS

 STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

24 (C) THE COMMISSIONER MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THE 25 PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE.

(1) TAKE ADVERSE ACTION OR DISCRIMINATE AGAINST AN
 EMPLOYEE BECAUSE THE EMPLOYEE EXERCISED IN GOOD FAITH THE RIGHTS
 PROTECTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE; OR

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1 (2) REDUCE AN EMPLOYEE'S TOTAL COMPENSATION OR ANY 2 ELEMENT OF THE EMPLOYEE'S COMPENSATION, INCLUDING TAKING ANY 3 ADVERSE ACTION AGAINST THE EMPLOYEE THAT MAY LEAD TO AN INCREASE IN 4 COSTS TO THE EMPLOYEE FOR:

(1) PREEMPT, LIMIT, OR OTHERWISE AFFECT ANY OTHER LAW,
 REGULATION, OR CONTRACT THAT PROVIDES GREATER COMPENSATION OR
 EMPLOYEE PROTECTIONS THAT ARE MORE GENEROUS THAN REQUIRED UNDER
 THIS SUBTITLE; OR

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this 19 Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any 20 reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other 21 provisions or any other application of this Act which can be given effect without the 22 invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are 23 declared severable.

24 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be 25 construed to apply retroactively and shall be applied to and interpreted to affect any 26 adverse action against an employee on or after January 1, 2014.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2014.
