4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain waivers from the federal Elementary and $\mathbf{5}$ Secondary Education Act requested by the State Department of Education to 6 the United States Department of Education to be consistent with State law and 7 regulations: requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations before 8 requesting certain waivers; requiring the State Superintendent of Schools to 9 submit a certain description of how certain waivers are consistent with State law and regulations, including certain references to certain statutes and 10 regulations, to the Governor and the General Assembly at least a certain 11 number of days before requesting certain waivers; the State Department of 12Education to submit a certain request for a waiver from the federal Elementary 13 and Secondary Education Act to the Legislative Policy Committee before the 14Department submits the proposed waiver request to the United States 15Department of Education; requiring the State Department of Education to give 16 17the Legislative Policy Committee a certain amount of time to review and comment on a certain proposed waiver request; and generally relating to the 18 19request requests for waivers to the United States Department of Education from 20the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act.
