A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Transit Administration – MARC Penn Line Extension

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Transit Administration to extend certain 4 passenger railroad service to Elkton, Maryland, by a certain date by negotiating $\mathbf{5}$ a certain contract with Amtrak; requiring the Administration to assess by a 6 certain date the feasibility of extending certain passenger railroad service to 7Newark, Delaware; requiring the Administration to submit a certain report to 8 certain committees of the General Assembly by a certain date each year; 9 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to passenger railroad services and the Maryland Transit Administration. 10

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That:

(a) (1) By January 1, 2020, the Maryland Transit Administration shall
 extend MARC passenger railroad service on the Penn line to Elkton, Maryland.

15 (2) To fulfill the requirement of paragraph (1) of this subsection, the 16 Maryland Transit Administration shall negotiate a contract with Amtrak to provide at 17 least one morning and one evening passenger railroad service to Elkton.

18 (b) By October 1, 2015, the Maryland Transit Administration shall assess 19 the feasibility of extending MARC passenger railroad service on the Penn line to 20 Newark, Delaware, including initiating discussions with the Southeastern 21 Pennsylvania Transportation Authority, Amtrak, and other entities concerning the 22 extension of passenger railroad service to Newark, Delaware.

(c) On or before September 30 of each year, the Maryland Transit
Administration shall submit a report, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State
Government Article, to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, Senate Finance

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
October 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 years and, at the end of
September 30, 2020, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
