20 21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 (1) In a county in which the circuit administrative judge has 2 established a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program under § 3–8C–02 of this subtitle; and
- 3 (2) To the extent that funds are provided in an annual State budget 4 for a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program.

- 6 (a) [(1) The Circuit Administrative Judge of the First Circuit may 7 establish a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program in one or more of the juvenile courts in 8 Dorchester County, Somerset County, Wicomico County, and Worcester County.
- 9 (2) The Circuit Administrative Judge of the Second Circuit may 10 establish a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program in the juvenile court in Talbot County.
- 11 (3) The Circuit Administrative Judge of the Third Circuit may 12 establish a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program in the juvenile court in Harford County.
- 13 (4) The Circuit Administrative Judge of the Seventh Circuit] A
 14 CIRCUIT ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE may establish a Truancy Reduction Pilot
 15 Program in the juvenile court in [Prince George's County] ANY COUNTY IN THE
 16 ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE'S CIRCUIT.
- 17 (b) After consultation with the administrative judges of the [first, second, 18 third, and seventh] circuits IN WHICH A TRUANCY REDUCTION PILOT PROGRAM 19 HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED, the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals may accept a gift or grant to implement the pilot programs in each respective circuit.
