- FOR the purpose of specifying that a day on which public schools are closed during a certain state of emergency shall be credited against the required minimum number of days that public schools shall be open requiring the State Board of Education to grant certain county boards of education certain adjustments and exceptions for certain school attendance if attendance is prevented on a day that the Governor declares a state of emergency; and making this Act an emergency measure.
