Public Safety - Hotels - Carbon Monoxide Alarms

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain hotels, on or after a certain date, to install a certain carbon monoxide alarm in a central location inside of each guest room 4 5 within the hotel or, under certain circumstances; authorizing the owner of a 6 hotel to install a certain carbon monoxide alarm within a certain distance from 7 carbon monoxide-producing fixtures and equipment within the hotel under 8 certain circumstances; altering a certain definition; defining a certain term; 9 making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to carbon 10 monoxide alarms.
