Workers' Compensation - Occupational Disease Presumptions - Paid Emergency Medical Services Providers <u>Rescue Squad Members and Paid</u> <u>Advanced Life Support Unit Members</u>

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of extending the presumption of compensability under the workers' 6 compensation law to include, under certain conditions, paid emergency medical 7 services providers rescue squad members and paid advanced life support unit 8 members who suffer from heart disease, hypertension, or lung disease resulting 9 in partial or total disability or death; extending the presumption of 10 compensability under the workers' compensation law to include, under certain conditions, paid emergency medical services providers rescue squad members 11 and paid advanced life support unit members who suffer from certain cancers 12 under certain circumstances; providing for the application of this Act; and 13 generally relating to compensability of paid emergency medical services 14providers rescue squad members and paid advanced life support unit members 15under the workers' compensation law. 16

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

 $\mathbf{5}$ A paid firefighter, paid fire fighting instructor, PAID EMERGENCY (a) MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDER RESCUE SQUAD MEMBER, PAID ADVANCED LIFE 6 SUPPORT UNIT MEMBER, or sworn member of the Office of the State Fire Marshal 78 employed by an airport authority, a county, a fire control district, a municipality, or 9 the State or a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit member who is a covered 10 employee under § 9-234 of this title is presumed to have an occupational disease that 11 12was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if:

(1) the individual has heart disease, hypertension, or lung disease;

14 (2) the heart disease, hypertension, or lung disease results in partial 15 or total disability or death; and

16 (3) in the case of a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting 17 instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit 18 member, the individual has met a suitable standard of physical examination before 19 becoming a firefighter, fire fighting instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life 20 support unit member.

21A paid firefighter, paid fire fighting instructor, PAID EMERGENCY (c) 22**MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDER** RESCUE SQUAD MEMBER, PAID ADVANCED LIFE 23SUPPORT UNIT MEMBER, or a sworn member of the Office of the State Fire Marshal 24employed by an airport authority, a county, a fire control district, a municipality, or 25the State or a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting instructor, volunteer rescue 26squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit member who is a covered 27employee under § 9–234 of this title is presumed to be suffering from an occupational 28disease that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if the 29individual:

(1) has leukemia or prostate, rectal, throat, multiple myeloma,
non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, brain, testicular, or breast cancer that is caused by contact
with a toxic substance that the individual has encountered in the line of duty;

(2) has completed at least 10 years of service as a firefighter, fire
fighting instructor, EMERCENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDER, rescue squad
member, or advanced life support unit member or in a combination of those jobs in the
department where the individual currently is employed or serves;

1 (3) is unable to perform the normal duties of a firefighter, fire fighting 2 instructor, **EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDER**, rescue squad member, or 3 advanced life support unit member in the department where the individual currently 4 is employed or serves because of the cancer or leukemia disability; and

5 (4) in the case of a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting 6 instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit 7 member, has met a suitable standard of physical examination before becoming a 8 firefighter, fire fighting instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit 9 member.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be 11 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have 12 any effect on or application to any claim filed for an occupational disease before the 13 effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2014.
