The Town of Denton is a rural government municipality serving a community of 4,418. Owners of the property, the Denton has partnered with the tenant, the Chesapeake Culinary Center, to renovate the historic Maryland Smart Site property.

The Chesapeake Culinary Center (CCC) is a grassroots, non-profit organization committed to the betterment of our community through job training and economic development. The organization was established in the fall of 2004 to provide culinary training to youth and adults and offers many student- run programs, which affords practicum-learning experience.

In addition to serving as the headquarters for the Chesapeake Culinary, this multi-use facility will be home to the Career and Technology Centers culinary arts class, Shore Gourmet Market, and a Community Kitchen Incubator to assist agriculturally-based start-up businesses.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The purpose of this project is to complete the renovation of the Maryland Smart Site (2010) designated historic structure known as Caroline High School located in Denton, Maryland. The c.1901building was Caroline County's first high school facility. A 25 year vacancy led to significant blight due to vandalism and general neglect. The property was acquired by the Town of Denton in 2005 and subsequently stabilized. Community partners worked for the following nine years to secure funding for the rehabilitation of the building. In 2013 Phase I was completed, transforming the first floor and basement into state-of-the-art classrooms, training and pastry kitchens and storefront.

Phase II will transform the second floor of the structure into a working kitchen and restaurant training area. This construction will include the renovation of the second floor (3,240 sq. ft.), replacement of the historic bell tower, bell, brickwork and geothermal installation (\$590,000). The exterior site work (19,401 sq. ft.) includes, drive installation, curb cut, parking, ADA/ABA accessible sidewalks, and storm water management (\$262,000).
