10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

Girl Scouts of Central Maryland (GSCM) is one of the largest Girl Scout Councils in the US with a membership of 25,000 girls supported by 10,000 volunteers all residing in the state of Maryland. We serve Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Harford and Howard. Established in 1962 through the merger of three Girl Scout Councils, the mission of Girl Scouts of Central Maryland is to develop girls of courage, confidence and character who make the world a better place. GSCM is the largest organization for girls and women in Maryland where, in an accepting and nurturing environment, girls build the character and skills necessary for success in the real world. In partnership with committed adults, girls develop qualities that will serve them all of their lives. Empowered to make positive choices for themselves and armed with the tools to serve those around them, Girl Scouts will improve local community sustainability. We are proud of the fact that 11% of girls are Girl Scouts in our area while nationally only 9% of girls are Girl Scouts. GSCM owns its Baltimore City headquarters and four camp properties in Anne Arundel (2 camps), Howard (1 camp) and Cecil (1 camp) counties.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

GSCM has capital need at Camp Whippoorwill, a 19 acre camp located in Pasadena on the Magothy River/Cockeys Creek. GSCM needs to install living shoreline in accordance with best management practices and guidelines of appropriate Local. State and Federal agencies to develop 700 feet of living shoreline and repair 1,250 square feet of stone wall and pressure treated retaining wall. A Living Shoreline is a design and construction approach that stabilizes shorelines by mimicking natural shorelines through ecological engineering. It is a dynamic system that seeks to replicate the processes found in natural shorelines. Natural shorelines are not static; they shift in response to the energies delivered to that particular location. They are designed to work with the energies in a given setting instead of armoring against them. Living Shorelines are 3-dimensional, consisting of lagoons, shallow aquatic beds, ponds, non-tidal wetlands and forests and integrate tidal, non-tidal, and terrestrial ecosystems. This approach uses natural materials native to the coastal plain. A Living Shorline is biologically diverse; it reestablishes a complex natural, aesthetically pleasing, self-sustaining coastal ecosystem with a natural coastal plant community. Another feature is that it integrates the adjacent landscape by setting a slope of 10% where possible, enabling waves to break on the shoreline up to elevation 8. Why GSCM's Camp Whippoorwills Living Shoreline? Restoration of the living shoreline will ensure that the soil, steep slopes and trees are maintained in their natural environment. Preservation of our waterways ensures that GSCM maintains our properties in proper stewardship for the future of our girls and the community at-large. Camp Whippoorwill is 19 acres of woodlands; property was purchased in 1928. This property is GSCMs oldest property. Camp Whippoorwill is a highly utilized property. In FY13 a total of 2,982 people utilized the property compared to 2,719 in FY12 which is an increase of nearly 10% over FY12. Camp Whippoorwill is utilized by The Y of Central Maryland annually for their summer day camp offerings. Girl Scout troops utilize the facility Friday Sunday for troop camping in the fall and spring and various summer programming occurs at the facility. In addition, Camp Whippoorwill is utilized for various programs, including summer programming options and trainings throughout the year by Girl Scout members. The shoreline, boat house and pier are highly regarded by Girl Scouts and the community at large. Repairs to the shoreline will also ensure that expanded water front program opportunities are made available to our girls. What is the relevance/significance of Camp Whippoorwill today? Preserving the integrity of the living shoreline will allow for many more years to come for Girl Scouts and the community at-large. Girl Scouts believe in being good environmental stewards. Exposing girls to the great outdoors is critical today! Exposing girls to outdoor activities in a safe and nurturing environment improves their health and self-esteem. What is the nugget in the Living Shoreline story that makes it relevant todaywhat is the going forward story? Camp Whippoorwill is GSCMs oldest camp property, the first camp property that the Council purchased in 1928. Today, Girl Scouts who camped at this property in the 1930s are still engaged and supportive of the Girl Scout Leadership Experience and outdoor education for our youth. Camp continues to be an important tradition and learning experience outdoor education and camping experiences help girls adjust to new experiences, test their boundaries, explore nature and understand the environment. What are the current issues with the site? Current issues include erosion of the retaining wall at the shoreline which is being undercut by water action. If left unresolved, failure of the wall is eminent which would cause soil erosion with major tree damage. Living Shoreline with Rock Sill Protection and Existing Structural repairs projected as follows: Install living shoreline in accordance with best management practices and guidelines of appropriate Local, State and Federal agencies to develop 700 feet of living shoreline and repair 1,250 square feet of stone wall and Pressure Treated retaining wall. Prepare and reclaim any stone along shoreline. Install finest filter fabric in footprint of new sill In
