Physical Education and Athletic Programs for Students With Disabilities - Funding

This bill requires the State Board of Education and each local board of education to ensure that adapted, allied, or unified physical education and athletic programs are adequately funded by the local board of education.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2014.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Local boards of education can meet the bill's requirement with existing

resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Chapters 464 and 465 of 2008 required the State Board of Education and local boards of education to ensure that students with disabilities have equal opportunities to participate in mainstream physical education and athletic programs in public schools. The State board and each local board of education must also ensure that adapted, allied, or unified physical education and athletic programs are available. Adapted programs are programs developed for a student with a disability. Allied sports and unified programs are specifically designed to combine groups of students with and without disabilities.

In addition, local boards of education are required to develop policies and procedures to promote and protect the inclusion of students with disabilities in mainstream physical education and athletic programs, and the State board must adopt a model policy to assist local boards with the implementation of these requirements. The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) must monitor local boards' compliance and provide technical assistance to local boards. COMAR 13A.06.04 defines the requirements for a Corollary Athletic Program in the local school systems, which is a program that is specifically designed to combine groups of students with and without disabilities together in physical activity.

Each local board of education must report annually on its plans to engage students with disabilities in physical education and athletics programs and on the participation of students with disabilities in these programs. MSDE must compile the reports and submit an annual report by August 1 to the General Assembly on local boards' compliance with State requirements.
