10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

Muslim Community Center, Inc., (MCC) is non-profit organization. In addition to providing traditional faith based services to Muslims, it also provides services to ALL regardless of faith, race, gender or other reservations.

Services consist of a comprehensive Medical Clinic servicing un-insured and in-need. Over 12,000 patient visits were recorded in 2013. Health fairs, Health counseling and awareness classes are organized.

Donated charitable funds are distributed to the families and individuals in need. Over 277 families were helped and over 400 individuals were provided food and clothing etc.

Nearly 450 students and over 150 adults are helped through educational services, counseling, mentorship and career development. Jobs Fairs are organized. Seniors activities are organized.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Building facilities need to be upgraded and expanded and furnished to accommodate Seniors Day Care.

To build a facility where Seniors who are left alone at home to fend for themselves during the day while their family, both husband and wife, have to go out to work and cannot afford to pay for the home care. Seniors will be able to meet in their familiar environment and traditional settings where they can socialize and converse in their own native languages and enjoys native foods. It will be a special facility to cater for the low-income at-risk seniors who are frail or are incapacitated or have limited mobility or are otherwise handicapped. The facility will be handicap-accessible with wheelchair accessible restrooms etc.

Storage for Clothing and a Pantry need to be built and furnished to store food items for distribution to the poor, the destitute and the needy of the Maryland State.

Over the 37 years of it's existence, the MCC has actively pursued harmonious relations with it's neighbors and other faith organizations in the area.
MCC's contribution has been recognized by the Governor of the State of Maryland, the County Executive of the Montgomery County and County Council's Chair for Health and Human Services, and has been awarded several proclamations.
