Prince George's County - State's Attorney - Salary PG 310-14

This bill increases, from \$150,000 to \$199,000, the salary of the Prince George's County State's Attorney. Pursuant to constitutional requirements, the salary increase takes effect at the beginning of the next term of office.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Prince George's County expenditures increase by \$31,900 in FY 2015 and by \$63,800 annually thereafter. Local revenues are not affected.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The State's Attorney for Prince George's County receives an annual salary of \$150,000. **Exhibit 1** shows the salary for the State's Attorney in each county based on fiscal 2014 data (where available), as provided by the Maryland Association of Counties.

Article III, § 35 of the Maryland Constitution prohibits the salary or compensation of any public officer from being increased or diminished during the individual's term of office, except those whose full term is fixed by law in excess of four years.

Local Fiscal Effect: County expenditures increase by \$31,900 in fiscal 2015 and by \$63,800 annually thereafter. The estimate accounts for the salary increase taking effect in January 2015, the beginning of the next term of office, and includes fringe benefits.
