This will allow CAC to compete with the ever changing technology in Audio, Sound and Lighting as well as bring larger acts into our theatre. The Gallery is currently an old classroom that needs renovation to cover the block walls with drywall, new lighting to showcase artwork as well as a new floor and a possible new dry sprinkler system.
