#### 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Skatepark of Baltimore Inc. is a grassroots, all-volunteer 501(c)3 nonprofit organization whose mission is to facilitate the construction of a public, custom, concrete, destination skatepark to provide a safe place for youth skateboard, bike, and rollerblade enthusiasts. We have secured our site through a partnership with the City of Baltimore, completed our park designs with community and youth input, created a process for construction of public skateparks in coordination with city officials, and secured fundraising commitments towards the cost of construction for the first and second phases of the park. Completion of this project is needed because current public facilities fail to meet the recreational needs of Baltimore's youth. Without appropriate facilities to recreate, skateboarders are often hassled by police or hurt in accidents when skating the city streets. The Skatepark of Baltimore engages an average of 500 youth and adult skateboarders in advocacy activities and offers close to 50 skateboard related special events and activities per year. The park will serve an average of 100 youth a day and bolster local tourism and business. Once completed, this city skatepark will help keep youth in school, in shape

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

A skatepark in Roosevelt Park was part of the 2004 Master Plan, developed by the Baltimore City Department of Recreation and Parks. All aspects of that plan have been completed except the skatepark. The young people of Hampden and Baltimore have been waiting for close to ten years for the facility promised to them. The Skatepark of Baltimore has had a number of fundraising successes to cover pre-development, site maintenance, improvements, and park construction costs. We have received grants from the Abell Foundation, the Parks and People Foundation, the Tony Hawk Foundation, and the Clayton Baker Trust, totaling \$75,000. We have raised \$50,000 through our own grassroots fundraising efforts. In 2012, we successfully completed a matching campaign with the Department of Recreation and Parks and raised \$180,000 - enough to begin construction of the first phase of our skatepark - a 5,000 square foot, concrete bowl completed in 2014. The second phase, a street plaza, is projected for October 2015 and is being funded through a \$75,000 state bond awarded to our organization last year with a match from the City of Baltimore (SB 232 rolled into HB 101). The third phase is projected for October 2016 and is contingent upon securing the necessary funding in the amount of \$150,000. While our organization will fundraise to meet the costs of park designs and increased programming for youth on site, acquiring bond financing Round all amounts to the nearest \$1,000. ## 28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Skatepark of Baltimore seeks to build a 16,000 square-foot skatepark in Roosevelt Park located in Hampden. Baltimore has over 7,000 regular (daily) skateboarders and close to 30,000 casual (monthly) skateboarders who require at least 44,000 square feet to recreate. Presently Baltimore has only two public skateparks which total less than 17,100 square feet. For nine years the Skatepark of Baltimore has served as a beacon of hope for the youth of Baltimore by undertaking advocacy on their behalf to build a world- class, facility in the City of Baltimore.

The Skatepark of Baltimore has a public private partnership with the City of Baltimore through the Department of Recreation and Parks to design and build a skatepark within an existing city park, Roosevelt Park, therefore we do not own or lease the specified property; the site is owned by the city. The Skatepark of Baltimore is an nine year-old, grassroots, volunteer-driven, nonprofit organization, therefore we have no paid employees. The members of the SOB Board of Directors accomplish many of the organization's activities. The Skatepark of Baltimore Inc. has over one hundred active volunteers.

Maryland is home to two of the oldest skateparks in the United States: Lansdowne, in Baltimore County, and Ocean Bowl, in Ocean City. The Roosevelt Park facility is expected to have a life of 25 years or more with minimal cost associated with operation, maintenance and upkeep. Once constructed, the skatepark will be a public facility and will not require staffing. The park will be maintained and operated through a partnership with Baltimore City's Department of Recreation and Parks.
