House Bill 168

(Delegate Schulz, et al.)

Economic Matters

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs and Finance

Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation - Boards, Commissions, and Councils - Member Removal

This bill establishes that a Governor-appointed member of specified boards, commissions, and councils under the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation (DLLR) is considered to have resigned if the member does not attend at least two-thirds of the official meetings held during any consecutive 12-month period. The Governor may waive a member's resignation and allow the member to continue serving if the reasons provided by the member for nonattendance are satisfactory to the Governor and the reasons are made public. The chair of a board, commission, or council must provide notice to the Governor of a member's resignation, and the Governor must appoint a successor.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. Altering the member removal process for the specified boards, commissions, and councils has no effect on State funds.

Current Law: Generally, the Governor may remove a member of a State board or commission for incompetence or misconduct. A member of a State board or commission

appointed by the Governor (which includes health occupations boards not affected by the bill) who fails to attend at least one-half (as opposed to two-thirds, under the bill) of the meetings of the board or commission during any 12-month period must be considered to have resigned. This provision remains in effect under the bill. No later than January 15 of the year following the end of the 12-month period the chairman of the board or commission must forward to the Governor the name of the individual considered to have resigned and a statement describing the individual's history of attendance during that period. The Governor may allow a member to continue serving if the member has been unable to attend meetings for reasons satisfactory to the Governor and the reasons are made public. When the individual is removed, the Governor must appoint a successor for the remainder of the term of the individual.

Background: Chapter 440 of 2013 requires the Governor to remove a member of the Maryland Home Improvement Commission if the member did not attend at least two-thirds of the commission meetings held during the prior year. The Governor may allow a member to continue serving if the member has been unable to attend meetings for reasons satisfactory to the Governor and the reasons are made public. When an individual is removed, the Governor must then appoint a successor. The bill leaves these provisions unchanged.
