## A BILL ENTITLED

Tanning Devices – Use by Minors – Prohibition

1 AN ACT concerning

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain owners, employees, and operators of tanning facilities from allowing minors to use tanning devices; making a stylistic change; and

- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 13 Article Health General
- 14 20–106.

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- (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 16 (2) "Tanning device" means any equipment that emits radiation used for tanning of the skin, including sunlamps, tanning booths, or tanning beds.
- 18 (3) "Tanning facility" means any place where a tanning device is used for a
- 19 fee, membership dues, or other compensation.

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1 An owner, employee, or operator of a tanning facility may not allow a minor 2 [under the age of 18 years] to use a tanning device [unless the minor's parent or legal 3 guardian provides written consent on the premises of the tanning facility and in the presence of an owner, employee, or operator of the tanning facility. 4 5 The owner, employee, or operator of a tanning facility shall require (c) 6 appropriate documentation to verify the age of an individual before allowing the individual 7 access to a tanning device. 8 (d) (1) The Secretary may impose on a person who violates this section: 9 (i) For a first violation, a civil penalty not to exceed \$250; 10 For a second violation, a civil penalty not to exceed \$500; and (ii) For each subsequent violation, a civil penalty not to exceed 11 (iii) 12 \$1,000. 13 (2)The Secretary may adopt regulations to implement and carry out this section. 14
