Vehicle Laws - Displaying Front Registration Plate - Exemption for Class L (Historic) and Class N (Street Rod) Vehicles

 from the requirement to display two registration plates if the front registration plate
 is stored in a certain manner inside the vehicle; making technical changes; and

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (a) (1) [On] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS 18 SUBSECTION, ON a vehicle for which two registration plates are required, one plate shall 19 be attached on the front and the other on the rear of the vehicle.

(2) FOR A CLASS L (HISTORIC) VEHICLE OR CLASS N (STREET ROD) VEHICLE, THE REGISTRATION PLATE INTENDED FOR THE FRONT OF THE VEHICLE MAY BE STORED INSIDE THE VEHICLE IN A MANNER THAT MAKES THE PLATE EASILY ACCESSIBLE FOR VERIFICATION UNDER SUBSECTION (I) OF THIS SECTION.

HOUSE BILL 62

1 (i) (1) It is the duty of every police officer to report to the Administration all 2 vehicles operated in violation of this section.

3 (2) The Administration shall verify whether the owner of a reported vehicle 4 has complied with this section.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2015.
