## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

### Human Services - No Wrong Door Pilot Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the No Wrong Door Pilot Program in the Department of 4 Human Resources; specifying the purpose, goals, and duties of the Program;  $\mathbf{5}$ requiring the Department to administer the Program, to develop requirements for 6 grant applications, and, in consultation with stakeholders, to develop certain criteria 7 for the evaluation of grant applications; requiring the Department to review grant 8 applications and award grants based on certain evaluation criteria and to track and 9 assess Program outcomes; authorizing the Department, beginning on a certain date, to award grants to private or public entities under the Program; requiring each 10 11 grantee under the Program annually to report certain information to the 12Department; requiring certain units of the State annually to provide the Department 13 with information regarding the number of individuals and families connected to 14services through each grantee; requiring the Department annually to convene the 15grantees under the Program for a certain symposium; requiring the Department 16 annually to report certain information and recommendations to the Governor and 17the General Assembly; authorizing the Department to adopt regulations to carry out 18 certain provisions of law; requiring the Governor to include in the annual budget for 19certain fiscal years a certain appropriation for the Program; providing for the 20termination of this Act; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the No 21Wrong Door Pilot Program.

13 (3) IN CONSULTATION WITH STAKEHOLDERS, DEVELOP CRITERIA 14 FOR THE EVALUATION OF GRANT APPLICATIONS THAT SHALL INCLUDE THE 15 APPLICANT'S ABILITY TO:

(I) LEVERAGE OTHER FUNDING;

17(II) CONNECT CLIENTS WITH A VARIETY OF SERVICES AND18PROGRAMS;

19 (III) BRING INNOVATIVE STRATEGIES TO THE STATE;

(IV) COLLABORATE WITH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PARTNERS;

21 (V) UNDERSTAND THE LEVEL AND TYPE OF NEEDS IN THE 22 COMMUNITY; AND

23 (VI) CONTRIBUTE TO GEOGRAPHIC DIVERSITY;

24(4) REVIEW GRANT APPLICATIONS AND AWARD GRANTS BASED ON25THE EVALUATION CRITERIA DEVELOPED UNDER ITEM (3) OF THIS SECTION; AND

26 (5) TRACK AND ASSESS PROGRAM OUTCOMES.

2 BEGINNING ON JULY 1, 2016, THE DEPARTMENT MAY AWARD GRANTS TO 3 PRIVATE OR PUBLIC ENTITIES UNDER THE PROGRAM.

4 **6–805.** 

5 EACH GRANTEE UNDER THE PROGRAM ANNUALLY SHALL REPORT TO THE 6 DEPARTMENT:

7 (1) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES SCREENED FOR 8 SERVICE NEEDS;

9 (2) THE NUMBER OF APPLICANTS ASSISTED;

10 (3) THE NUMBER AND TYPE OF PROGRAMS TO WHICH REFERRALS 11 WERE MADE;

12 (4) A DESCRIPTION OF OUTREACH EFFORTS UNDERTAKEN; AND

13(5) A DESCRIPTION OF SUCCESSFUL STRATEGIES, DIFFICULTIES14ENCOUNTERED, AND LESSONS LEARNED.

24	FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017, FISCAL YEAR 2018, AND FISCAL YEAR 2019, THE

FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017, FISCAL YEAR 2018, AND FISCAL YEAR 2019, THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET AN APPROPRIATION OF AT LEAST \$500,000 FOR THE PROGRAM.

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1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 2 1, 2015. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of June 30, 2019, 3 with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and 4 of no further force and effect.
