Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2015, and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of One Billion. Sixty-Eight Million, Five Hundred Forty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,068,545,000), One Billion, Sixty-Three Million, Six Hundred Seventy Thousand, One Hundred Thirty-Four Dollars (\$1,063,670,134), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of the State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to certain requirements that certain matching funds be provided and expended by certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan; imposing a certain tax on all assessable property in the State; making a certain Watershed Implementation Plan appropriation contingent on the failure of certain legislation; authorizing the creation of State Debt in certain years to be used for certain purposes; requiring that certain grantees convey certain easements under certain circumstances to the Maryland Historical Trust; authorizing certain grantees to appeal certain determinations by the Maryland Historical Trust or the Director to the Maryland Historical Trust Board of Trustees; providing that a certain decision by the Maryland Historical Trust Board of Trustees is final and not subject to administrative or judicial review; providing that the proceeds of certain loans must be expended or encumbered by a certain date; authorizing certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans to be expended for
