Workers' Compensation – Heart Disease and Hypertension Presumption – Anne Arundel County Correctional Detention Officers

- 4 FOR the purpose of extending the presumption of compensability under the workers' 5 compensation law to include, subject to certain conditions, Anne Arundel County 6 correctional detention officers who suffer from heart disease or hypertension 7 resulting in partial or total disability or death; requiring Anne Arundel County 8 correctional detention officers to submit certain medical disclosures to a certain 9 official; providing that, subject to a certain limitation, workers' compensation 10 benefits received under this Act are in addition to certain retirement benefits; 11 altering the definition of "public safety employee" to include Anne Arundel County 12 correctional detention officers for the purposes of determining certain compensation; 13 providing for the application of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to compensability of Anne Arundel County correctional detention officers under the 14 workers' compensation law. 15

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 4 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 7 (1) (b) A paid police officer employed by an airport authority, a county, the 8 Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, a municipality, or the State, 9 a deputy sheriff of Montgomery County, or, subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, a deputy sheriff of Anne Arundel County, ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY CORRECTIONAL 10 **DETENTION OFFICER**, deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional 11 officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, Prince George's County correctional officer, 12 13 or deputy sheriff of Allegany County is presumed to be suffering from an occupational 14 disease that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if:

- 17 (ii) the heart disease or hypertension results in partial or total disability or death.
 - COUNTY CORRECTIONAL DETENTION OFFICER, [a] deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer is entitled to the presumption under this subsection only to the extent that the individual suffers from heart disease or hypertension that is more severe than the individual's heart disease or hypertension condition existing prior to the individual's employment as a deputy sheriff of Anne Arundel County, ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY CORRECTIONAL DETENTION OFFICER, deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer.
 - sheriff of Anne Arundel County, **ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY CORRECTIONAL DETENTION**OFFICER, [a] deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer, as a condition of employment, shall submit to a medical examination to determine any heart disease or hypertension condition existing prior to the individual's employment as a deputy sheriff of Anne Arundel County, **ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY CORRECTIONAL DETENTION**OFFICER, deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer.

- 1 Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, any paid (e) (1) 2 firefighter, paid firefighting instructor, sworn member of the Office of the State Fire 3 Marshal, paid police officer, paid law enforcement employee of the Department of Natural 4 Resources, deputy sheriff of Anne Arundel County, ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY CORRECTIONAL DETENTION OFFICER, park police officer or employee of the 5 6 Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission, deputy sheriff of Montgomery 7 County, deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, deputy 8 sheriff of Prince George's County, or Prince George's County correctional officer who is eligible for benefits under subsection (a), (b), (c), or (d) of this section or the dependents of 9 10 those individuals shall receive the benefits in addition to any benefits that the individual 11 or the dependents of the individual are entitled to receive under the retirement system in 12 which the individual was a participant at the time of the claim.
