FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services to
require an individual to pass a polygraph examination before being appointed to
serve as a correctional officer in a correctional facility; requiring the Secretary to
adopt regulations governing the administration of the polygraph examination
required by this Act; and generally relating to correctional officers.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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1 (f) (1) The [Division may] **SECRETARY SHALL** require an individual to pass 2 a polygraph examination before being appointed to serve as a correctional officer in a 3 correctional facility.

4 (2) The [Commissioner] **SECRETARY** shall adopt regulations governing 5 the administration of the polygraph examination [authorized] **REQUIRED** under 6 paragraph (1) of this subsection.
