BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. 21That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 22 Article - Health - General 23 18–214.1.

- 1 (2) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Health of the Baltimore 2 City Health Department.
- 3 (3) "Program" means the Expedited Partner Therapy [Pilot] Program.
- 4 (b) There is an Expedited Partner Therapy [Pilot] Program in the Baltimore City 5 Health Department.
- 6 (c) The purpose of the Program is to provide antibiotic therapy to the partner of 7 a patient diagnosed with a sexually transmitted infection identified in subsection (d) of this 8 section in order to contain the infection and stop the further spread of it.
- 9 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in a public health clinic 10 established by the Commissioner in Baltimore City, the following health care providers 11 may dispense or otherwise provide antibiotic therapy to any sexual partner of a patient 12 diagnosed with chlamydia or gonorrhea without making a personal physical assessment of 13 the patient's partner:
- 14 (1) A physician licensed under Title 14 of the Health Occupations Article;
- 15 (2) [A certified nurse practitioner] AN ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSE 16 WITH PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY CERTIFIED UNDER TITLE 8 OF THE HEALTH 17 OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE, ACTING in accordance with § 8–508 of the Health Occupations 18 Article; and
- 19 (3) An authorized physician assistant LICENSED UNDER TITLE 15 OF 20 THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE, ACTING in accordance with § 15–302.2 of the 21 Health Occupations Article.
- 22 (e) The Secretary shall adopt regulations to implement the requirements of this 23 section.
- [(f) On or before December 31, 2007, and each year thereafter, the Baltimore City Health Department shall report to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly, on the operation and performance of the Expedited Partner Therapy Pilot Program.]
