- 1 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, every new application for a 2 license shall be made to the Board of License Commissioners on forms prescribed by the 3 Comptroller and sworn to by the applicant. Every application for a license shall contain the 4 following:
 - (18) (i) [A] SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPHS (II) THROUGH (IV) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, A certificate signed by at least ten citizens who are owners of real estate and registered voters of the precinct in which the business is to be conducted, stating the length of time each has been acquainted with the applicant, or in the case of a corporation with the individuals making the application; that they have examined the application of the applicant and that they have good reason to believe that all the statements contained in this application are true, and that they are of the opinion that the applicant is a suitable person to obtain the license. The certificate must have a statement that the signers of it are familiar with the premises upon which the proposed business is to be conducted, and that they believe the premises are suitable for the conduct of the business of a retail dealer in alcoholic beverages.
- 16 (ii) In St. Mary's County, persons who are owners of real estate 17 within 5 miles of the premises for which a license is sought and registered voters of St. 18 Mary's County shall be those persons signing the certificate.
- 19 (iii) The certificate required by subparagraph (i) of this paragraph is 20 not necessary for applications filed in Dorchester County, Prince George's County, 21 Montgomery County, Anne Arundel County, and Baltimore County.
- 22 (IV) 1. SUBJECT TO SUBSUBPARAGRAPH 2 OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH, IN FREDERICK COUNTY, PERSONS WHO ARE OWNERS OF REAL ESTATE WITHIN 5,000 FEET OF THE PREMISES FOR WHICH A LICENSE IS SOUGHT SHALL BE THOSE PERSONS SIGNING THE CERTIFICATE.
