## A BILL ENTITLED

## Procurement - State Funds - Energy Efficient Outdoor Lighting Fixtures

3 FOR the purpose of expanding the prohibition on the use of State funds to install or replace 4 certain luminaires by applying the prohibition to all permanent outdoor luminaires 5 unless the luminaires meet certain requirements; establishing certain requirements 6 for luminaires intended for certain lighting purposes; establishing certain 7 circumstances that require the use of certain fully shielded luminaires; providing 8 that certain requirements do not apply to certain public work contracts or certain 9 projects funded in the capital budget; adding to certain requirements that the Board of Public Works is authorized to waive; requiring the Board of Public Works to adopt 10 11 certain regulations to establish a certain process and schedule for certain waiver 12 requests; defining certain terms; repealing a certain definition; and generally 13 relating to the use of State funds and energy efficient outdoor lighting fixtures.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 23 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

- 1 (2) "DIRECT LIGHT" MEANS THE LIGHT EMITTED BY A LUMINAIRE 2 FROM THE LAMP OR A REFLECTOR OR THROUGH A REFRACTOR.
- 3 (3) "FACADE LIGHTING" MEANS PERMANENT OUTDOOR LUMINAIRES
  4 THAT ARE SPECIFICALLY INTENDED TO ILLUMINATE THE EXTERIOR SURFACES OF
  5 BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES.
- 6 (4) "FULLY SHIELDED LUMINAIRE" MEANS A LUMINAIRE THAT
  7 ALLOWS NO DIRECT LIGHT EMISSION ABOVE A HORIZONTAL PLANE THROUGH THE
  8 LUMINAIRE'S LOWEST LIGHT-EMITTING PART FROM ITS MOUNTED POSITION.
- 9 (5) "GLARE" MEANS LIGHT EMITTED BY A LUMINAIRE THAT CAUSES 10 DISCOMFORT OR REDUCED VISIBILITY.
- 11 **[**(2)**] (6)** "Lamp" means the component of a luminaire that produces the 12 light.
- 13 (7) "LIGHT TRESPASS" MEANS LIGHT THAT FALLS BEYOND THE 14 PROPERTY IT IS INTENDED TO ILLUMINATE.
- 15 [(3)] (8) "Lumen" means a unit of measurement of luminous flux.
- [(4)] (9) "Luminaire" means the complete lighting unit, including the lamp or other component that produces light and the assembly that holds the lamp, including an assembly housing, a mounting bracket or pole socket, a lamp holder, a ballast, a reflector or mirror, and a refractor or lens.
- 20 (10) "PARKING LOT LIGHTING" MEANS PERMANENT OUTDOOR 21 LUMINAIRES SPECIFICALLY INTENDED TO ILLUMINATE UNCOVERED VEHICLE 22 PARKING AREAS.
- 23 (11) "PERMANENT OUTDOOR LUMINAIRE" MEANS A LUMINAIRE FOR USE IN AN EXTERIOR ENVIRONMENT THAT IS INSTALLED WITH A MOUNTING NOT INTENDED FOR RELOCATION.
- [(5) "Restricted uplight luminaire" means a luminaire that:
- 27 (i) except for a 0.5% maximum incidental uplight from reflection off 28 mounting hardware, allows no direct light emission above a horizontal plane through the 29 luminaire's lowest light—emitting part; and
- 30 (ii) emits no more than 10% of the total direct light emission at or 31 above a vertical angle of 80 degrees.]

(12) "ROADWAY LIGHTING" 1 **MEANS PERMANENT OUTDOOR** 2 LUMINAIRES SPECIFICALLY INTENDED TO ILLUMINATE ROADWAYS. (13) "SKY GLOW" MEANS A CONDITION CAUSED BY LIGHT DIRECTED 3 4 UPWARDS OR SIDEWAYS THAT REDUCES THE ABILITY TO VIEW THE NIGHT SKY. 5 [(6)] **(14)** "State building" means a building owned or leased by the State or a unit of the State. 6 7 **(1)** (b) This section does not apply to a luminaire: [(1)] (I) located on the grounds of a correctional facility; 8 9 [(2)] (II) required by federal regulation; (III) required for storm operation activities performed by the 10 11 Department of Transportation; 12 [(4)] (IV) required to illuminate the State flag or the flag of the United 13 States: used for sign illumination; [or] 14 [(5)] (V) 15 [(6)] **(VI)** REPLACED in a lighting plan where less than 25% of the luminaires are to be replaced; 16 (VII) USED TO ILLUMINATE THE FIELD OF PLAY AT A SPORTS 17 18 **FACILITY;** 19 (VIII) USED ON A TEMPORARY BASIS TO PROVIDE OUTDOOR 20 LIGHTING FOR EMERGENCY PROCEDURES OR NIGHTTIME WORK; 21(IX) USED FOR NAVIGATIONAL LIGHTING SYSTEMS AND OTHER 22 LIGHTING NECESSARY FOR AVIATION AND NAUTICAL SAFETY; OR 23**(X) USED** TO **ILLUMINATE** TUNNELS AND **ROADWAY** 24UNDERPASSES. THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO: 25**(2)** 26 **(I)** A PUBLIC WORK CONTRACT OF LESS THAN \$500,000;

- 3 (c) State funds may not be used to install or replace a permanent outdoor 4 luminaire [for lighting on the grounds of any State building or facility] unless:
- 5 (1) the luminaire is designed to maximize energy conservation and to 6 minimize light pollution, glare, and light trespass;
- 7 **[**(2) the illumination produced by the luminaire is the minimum 8 illumination necessary for the intended purpose of the lighting; and
- 9 (3) for a luminaire with an output of more than 1,800 lumens, the luminaire is a restricted uplight luminaire.]
- 11 (2) THE LUMINAIRE PROVIDES SURFACE LIGHTING LEVELS THAT DO
  12 NOT EXCEED THE MINIMUM LIGHTING LEVELS:
- 13 (I) ADOPTED BY THE ILLUMINATING ENGINEERING SOCIETY;
- 14 (II) ESTABLISHED BY THE MODEL OUTDOOR LIGHTING
  15 ORDINANCE AS ADOPTED JOINTLY BY THE ILLUMINATING ENGINEERING SOCIETY
  16 AND THE DARK SKY ASSOCIATION; OR
- 17 (III) OTHERWISE RECOGNIZED AS NATIONAL STANDARDS IN THE 18 FIELD OF LIGHTING;
- 19 (3) FOR A LUMINAIRE INTENDED FOR ROADWAY LIGHTING OR 20 PARKING LOT LIGHTING THAT IS MOUNTED TO A POLE, BUILDING, OR ANY OTHER 21 STRUCTURE, THE LUMINAIRE IS A FULLY SHIELDED LUMINAIRE; AND
- 22 (4) FOR A LUMINAIRE INTENDED FOR FACADE LIGHTING, THE 23 LUMINAIRE IS SHIELDED TO REDUCE GLARE, SKY GLOW, AND LIGHT TRESPASS TO 24 THE GREATEST EXTENT POSSIBLE.
- 25 (d) (1) The Board of Public Works or the Board's designee may waive the requirement of subsection [(c)(3)] (C) of this section if, after a request for a waiver has been made, the Board of Public Works or the Board's designee determines that the waiver is necessary for the lighting application.
