4 (d) (1) Unless the driver of the motor vehicle received a citation from a police 5 officer at the time of the violation AND SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C)(2) OF THIS 6 SECTION, the owner or, in accordance with subsection (g)(5) of this section, the driver of a 7 motor vehicle is subject to a civil penalty if the motor vehicle is recorded by a traffic control 8 signal monitoring system while being operated in violation of § 21–202(h) of this subtitle.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2015.
