4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Howard County Board of License Commissioners to $\mathbf{5}$ issue a special event – education beer and wine tasting alcoholic beverages permit 6 and a special event – education beer, wine, and liquor tasting alcoholic beverages 7 permit; specifying that a special event – education alcoholic beverages permit 8 authorized under this Act may be issued to a holder of a certain alcoholic beverages 9 license; specifying that a holder of a special event – education alcoholic beverages 10 permit authorized under this Act may provide from the holder's inventory certain 11 alcoholic beverages to a consumer who has preregistered for a certain event, subject 12to certain limitations; specifying a permit fee; authorizing the Board to adopt certain regulations; defining a certain term; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in 13 14 Howard County.

12 (III) LIQUOR IN A QUANTITY OF MORE THAN <u>1/4</u> <u>1/2</u> OUNCE FROM 13 ANY INDIVIDUAL BRAND AND NOT MORE THAN <u>1 OUNCE</u> <u>3 OUNCES</u> IN THE 14 AGGREGATE TO ANY ONE PERSON IN A SINGLE DAY.

15 (6) THE ANNUAL PERMIT FEE FOR A SPECIAL EVENT – EDUCATION
16 BWLT PERMIT IS \$100 IN ADDITION TO THE FEE FOR ANY OTHER ALCOHOLIC
17 BEVERAGES LICENSE.

18 (D) THE HOWARD COUNTY BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS MAY 19 ADOPT REGULATIONS PROVIDING ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS TO IMPLEMENT 20 THIS SECTION.

21 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 22 1, 2015.
