### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Motor Vehicles – Wearable Computer With Head–Mounted Display – Prohibited

  a certain term; and generally relating to prohibiting the wearing or use of a wearable

# 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

#### (1) IS WORN ON AN INDIVIDUAL'S HEAD; AND

2 (2) PROJECTS VISUAL INFORMATION INTO THE FIELD OF VISION OF 3 THE INDIVIDUAL WEARING THE DEVICE.

4 (B) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE ON A HIGHWAY 5 WHILE WEARING OR USING A WEARABLE COMPUTER WITH A HEAD-MOUNTED 6 DISPLAY.

7 27-101.

8 (a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the 9 Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation:

10 (1) Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any other 11 law of this State; or

12 (2) Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of the 13 Maryland Vehicle Law.

14 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a 15 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is 16 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October 1, 2015.
