CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Ethics – Former Legislators – Lobbying**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a former member of the General Assembly from assisting
4 or representing another party for compensation in a matter that is the subject of
5 legislative action until the later of the conclusion of the next regular session that
6 begins after the member leaves office or 6 months after the date that the campaign
7 finance entity of the member makes a transfer to another campaign committee; and
8 generally relating to public ethics, former legislators, and lobbying.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – General Provisions**

17 5–504.

18 (d) (1) Except for a former member of the General Assembly, who shall be
19 subject to the restrictions provided under paragraph (2) of this subsection, a former official

1 or employee may not assist or represent a party, other than the State, in a case, a contract,
2 or any other specific matter for compensation if:

3 (i) the matter involves State government; and

4 (ii) the former official or employee participated significantly in the
5 matter as an official or employee.

6 (2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, [until
7 the conclusion of the next regular session that begins after the member leaves office,] a
8 former member of the General Assembly may not assist or represent another party for
9 compensation in a matter that is the subject of legislative action **UNTIL THE LATER OF:**

10 **1. THE CONCLUSION OF THE NEXT REGULAR SESSION**
11 **THAT BEGINS AFTER THE MEMBER LEAVES OFFICE; OR**

12 **2. 6 MONTHS AFTER THE DATE THAT THE CAMPAIGN**
13 **FINANCE ENTITY OF THE MEMBER MAKES A TRANSFER TO ANOTHER CAMPAIGN**
14 **FINANCE ENTITY.**

15 (ii) The limitation under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph on
16 representation by a former member of the General Assembly does not apply to the former
17 member's representation of a municipal corporation, county, or State governmental entity.

18 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED,** That this Act shall take effect
19 **October 1, 2015.**
