A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Garrett County - Alcoholic Beverages - Special Multiple Event Class C Licenses

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring in Garrett County that a certain organization for which a special multiple event Class C license is issued ensure that at least one individual 4 5 who is certified by an approved alcohol awareness program is on the premises when 6 alcoholic beverages may be sold; authorizing a holder of a special multiple event 7 Class C license to store certain alcoholic beverages between certain events under 8 certain circumstances; requiring the license holder to keep certain records in a 9 certain manner; authorizing certain personnel of the Comptroller's Office and the Board of License Commissioners of Garrett County to inspect certain records in a 10 11 certain manner; providing that a license holder who violates this Act is subject to 12 certain fines and denial of certain licenses; making a technical change; and generally 13 relating to alcoholic beverages in Garrett County.

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
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- 23 (p) (1) In Garrett County, there are 4 types of special Class C beer, beer and 24 wine, or beer, wine and liquor licenses available, as follows:
 - (i) A special 2-day Class C license for a fee of \$50;

3	1. Special 2-day Class C license;
4	2. Special 6-day Class C license;
5	3. Special 12–day Class C license; or
6	4. Special [multi-event] MULTIPLE EVENT Class C license.
7 8 9 10	(3) THE ORGANIZATION FOR WHICH A SPECIAL MULTIPLE EVENT CLASS C LICENSE IS ISSUED SHALL ENSURE THAT AT LEAST ONE SERVER WHO IS CERTIFIED BY AN APPROVED ALCOHOL AWARENESS PROGRAM IS ON THE PREMISES WHEN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE SERVED.
11 12 13	(4) (I) THIS PARAGRAPH APPLIES ONLY TO THE HOLDER OF A SPECIAL MULTIPLE EVENT CLASS C LICENSE WHO HAS AN APPROVED LICENSED PREMISES.
14 15 16	(II) ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES MAY BE STORED ON THE LICENSED PREMISES BETWEEN THE INDIVIDUAL LICENSED EVENTS IF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES:
17 18	1. ARE IN A SPECIALLY IDENTIFIED LOCKED AND SECURED LOCATION; AND
19 20	2. ARE NOT SOLD OR CONSUMED EXCEPT DURING LICENSED EVENT HOURS FOR LICENSED EVENT PURPOSES.
21 22 23	(III) 1. A LICENSE HOLDER SHALL KEEP COMPLETE AND ACCURATE RECORDS OF ALL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES PURCHASED AND SOLD ON THE LICENSED PREMISES.
24	2. THE RECORDS SHALL BE:
25 26	A. MAINTAINED ON THE LICENSED PREMISES FOR 2 YEARS; AND
27 28 29	B. AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION BY AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL OF THE COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE AND THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS.

2	PRE- AND POST-INVENTORY OF ALL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES FOR EACH INDIVIDUAL
3	EVENT.
4	(IV) A LICENSE HOLDER WHO VIOLATES THIS PARAGRAPH IS
5	SUBJECT TO:
6	1. FOR THE FIRST OFFENSE, A FINE OF \$100; AND
7	2. FOR THE SECOND OFFENSE, A FINE NOT EXCEEDING
8	\$500 AND DENIAL OF FUTURE REQUESTS FOR A LICENSE FOR AN INDIVIDUAL EVENT
9	OR A SPECIAL MULTIPLE EVENT LICENSE.
