A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Transit Administration Oversight and Planning Board

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Transit Administration Oversight and 4 Planning Board; providing for the membership, term of office, powers, duties, and 5 staffing of the Board; providing that a member of the Board may not receive 6 compensation, but is entitled to reimbursement for certain expenses; requiring the 7 Board to submit an annual report to the Governor and the General Assembly; 8 requiring the Board to develop and adopt a certain strategic plan and to review and 9 update the strategic plan every 5 years; requiring the Board to designate one of its members to oversee and report on certain citizens' advisory councils; defining a 10 11 certain term; and generally relating to the Maryland Transit Administration 12 Oversight and Planning Board.

- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 24 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 (a) The exercise of the powers and duties of the Administration is subject to the 2 authority of the Secretary and, where applicable, the Maryland Transportation Authority 3 AND THE MARYLAND TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION OVERSIGHT AND PLANNING BOARD.
- 5 (b) By regulation or directive, the Secretary or, where applicable, the Maryland 6 Transportation Authority may require that the exercise of any power or duty of the 7 Administration be subject to the prior approval of the Secretary [or], the Maryland 8 Transportation Authority, [as the case may be] OR THE MARYLAND TRANSIT 9 ADMINISTRATION OVERSIGHT AND PLANNING BOARD.

- 11 (Q) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL DESIGNATE AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR
 12 OTHER STAFF TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO THE MARYLAND TRANSIT

- 15 **[(q)] (R)** Subject to the limitations imposed by this title, the Administration may exercise all powers reasonably necessary to the declared objects and purposes of this title.

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- 18 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "BOARD" MEANS THE MARYLAND TRANSIT 19 ADMINISTRATION OVERSIGHT AND PLANNING BOARD.
- 20 (B) THERE IS A MARYLAND TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION OVERSIGHT AND 21 PLANNING BOARD.
- 22 (C) THE BOARD CONSISTS OF:
- 23 (1) THE FOLLOWING EX OFFICIO MEMBERS:
- 24 (I) THE MAYOR OF BALTIMORE CITY, OR THE MAYOR'S 25 DESIGNEE;
- 26 (II) THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE OF BALTIMORE COUNTY, OR THE 27 COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S DESIGNEE; AND
- 28 (III) THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE OF ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY, OR 29 THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S DESIGNEE; AND
 - (2) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR:

11	(V) AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A DISABILITY OR WHO REPRESENTS
12	AN ORGANIZATION THAT PROVIDES SERVICES FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH
13	DISABILITIES;
14	(VI) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY
15	SELECTED FROM AMONG THE FOLLOWING ORGANIZATIONS:
16	1. THE GREATER BALTIMORE COMMITTEE;
17	2. THE BALTIMORE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION;

19	3. THE CENTRAL MARYLAND TRANSPORTATION
20	ALLIANCE; AND
21	(VII) A REPRESENTATIVE OF A TRANSIT UNION REPRESENTING
22	EMPLOYEES OF THE ADMINISTRATION.
23	(D) (1) EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR:

24	(I) SERVES FOR A TERM OF 3 YEARS; AND
25	(II) MAY NOT SERVE MORE THAN TWO CONSECUTIVE TERMS.
26	(2) THE INITIAL TERM OF THE MEMBERS APPOINTED TO THE BOARD
	BY THE GOVERNOR ARE STAGGERED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 (I) THE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER
- 2 SUBSECTION (C)(2)(I), (III), (V), AND (VII) OF THIS SECTION SHALL SERVE FOR A
- 3 TERM OF 3 YEARS; AND
- 4 (II) THE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER
- 5 SUBSECTION (C)(2)(II), (IV), AND (VI) OF THIS SECTION SHALL SERVE FOR A TERM
- 6 OF 2 YEARS.
- 7 (3) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A NEW MEMBER TO FILL ANY
- 8 VACANCY ON THE BOARD FOR THE REMAINDER OF THAT TERM AND UNTIL A
- 9 SUCCESSOR QUALIFIES.
- 10 **(E)** THE BOARD SHALL:
- 11 (1) ANNUALLY ELECT A CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR FROM AMONG THE
- 12 MEMBERS OF THE BOARD;
- 13 (2) ORGANIZE AND ESTABLISH POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR
- 14 OPERATIONS OF THE BOARD AS IT DEEMS APPROPRIATE, INCLUDING CONFLICT OF
- 15 INTEREST REQUIREMENTS THAT PROHIBIT A MEMBER OF THE BOARD FROM HAVING
- 16 ANY FINANCIAL OR NONFINANCIAL INTEREST IN A MATTER OVER WHICH THE BOARD
- 17 HAS JURISDICTION;
- 18 (3) NO LATER THAN 4 MONTHS AFTER THE BOARD ORGANIZES, AND
- 19 AFTER AN OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC REVIEW AND COMMENT, ADOPT BYLAWS TO
- 20 GOVERN OPERATIONS OF THE BOARD:
- 21 (4) MEET AS THE BOARD DEEMS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE
- 22 DUTIES OF THE BOARD; AND
- 23 (5) KEEP MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS OF THE BOARD AND MAINTAIN
- 24 PROPER RECORDS OF ALL TRANSACTIONS OF THE BOARD.
- 25 (F) (1) IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 7–204(Q) OF THIS SUBTITLE, PRINCIPAL
- 26 STAFF FOR THE BOARD SHALL BE PROVIDED BY THE ADMINISTRATION.
- 27 (2) ADDITIONAL STAFF FOR THE BOARD MAY BE PROVIDED BY THE
- 28 ENTITIES REPRESENTED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.
- 29 (G) A MEMBER OF THE BOARD:
- 30 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD;
- 31 **BUT**

- 1 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 2 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

 3 (H) IN ADDITION TO ITS DUTIES UNDER SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION, THE BOARD SHALL:
- 5 (1) ENGAGE IN STRATEGIC TRANSIT PLANNING, INCLUDING:
- 6 (I) DEVELOPING AND ADOPTING AN INTERMEDIATE AND 7 LONG-RANGE STRATEGIC TRANSIT PLAN CONCERNING THE TRANSIT NEEDS OF THE 8 ADMINISTRATION'S ZONES OF OPERATION;
- 9 (II) IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE BALTIMORE METROPOLITAN
 10 COUNCIL, ACT AS A GATEKEEPER FOR LOCAL, STATE, AND FEDERAL PLANNING
 11 PROCESSES;
- 12 (III) REVIEW AND COMMENT ON LONG-RANGE PLANS UNDER 13 THE MARYLAND CONSOLIDATED TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM; AND
- 14 (IV) REVIEW AND COMMENT ON TRANSPORTATION
 15 OPERATIONS, PLANS, AND SERVICES PROPOSED BY OR FOR BALTIMORE CITY AND
 16 THE COUNTIES IN THE BALTIMORE METROPOLITAN AREA THAT COMPLEMENT THE
 17 TRANSIT PLANS AND SERVICES OF THE ADMINISTRATION;
- 18 (2) HAVE APPROVAL AUTHORITY OVER:
- 19 (I) THE ADMINISTRATION'S ANNUAL OPERATING PLAN FOR 20 CORE SERVICES, PUBLIC SAFETY, AND MARKETING; AND
- 21 (II) SPECIFIC POLICIES AND DECISIONS THAT ARE KEY TO 22 ADMINISTRATION SERVICE QUALITY;
- 23 (3) SOLICIT CONSUMER INPUT AND EVALUATE TRANSIT SYSTEM 24 PRIORITIES AND RESOURCE ALLOCATION;
- 25 (4) (I) CONDUCT A REVIEW OF ADMINISTRATION POLICIES AND 26 PROCEDURES WHEN CALLED INTO QUESTION BY CITIZEN COMPLAINTS;
- 27 (II) PUBLISH FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS BASED ON 28 THE REVIEW; AND

- (III) DIRECT THE SECRETARY AND THE ADMINISTRATION TO 1 2 MAKE ANY NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE CHANGES; 3 **(5)** CONVENE SUBCOMMITTEES OR OTHER APPROPRIATE ENTITIES 4 TO GATHER INFORMATION AND SUGGESTIONS REGARDING TRANSIT SERVICE FROM 5 NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS, CIVIC FOUNDATIONS, EMPLOYERS, AND TRANSIT 6 RIDERS AND TO STUDY: 7 **(I)** PUBLIC-PRIVATE **PARTNERSHIP PLANNING AND** 8 OVERSIGHT; 9 (II)EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION AND OTHER LABOR MATTERS; 10 (III) FINANCES AND AUDITS; AND 11 (IV) CONSUMER TRANSPORTATION MATTERS; 12 **(6)** DESIGNATE ONE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD TO: 13 (I)OVERSEE THE CITIZENS' ADVISORY **COUNCILS** 14 ESTABLISHED IN THE GEOGRAPHIC AREAS SERVED BY THE ADMINISTRATION; AND SUBMIT PERIODIC REPORTS ABOUT THE ACTIVITIES AND 15 (II)CONCERNS OF THE CITIZENS' ADVISORY COUNCILS TO THE BOARD OR AN 16 17 APPROPRIATE SUBCOMMITTEE OF THE BOARD; 18 **(7)** ADOPT POLICIES **THAT ENCOURAGE** ADMINISTRATION 19 PRACTICES THAT PROMOTE PUBLIC SAFETY, TRANSPARENCY, ACCOUNTABILITY, 20CUSTOMER SERVICE, REGULAR COMMUNICATION WITH THE PUBLIC, AND PRUDENT 21FINANCIAL DECISION MAKING; 22 ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30 OF EACH YEAR, COMPILE AND 23SUBMIT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY A REPORT CONCERNING THE 24ADMINISTRATION'S PROGRESS IN MEETING THE STRATEGIC PLAN ADOPTED BY THE 25 26 BOARD UNDER THIS SECTION; AND
- 27 (9) REVIEW AND REVISE THE STRATEGIC TRANSIT PLAN OF THE 28 BOARD FOR THE ADMINISTRATION EVERY 5 YEARS.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 30 October 1, 2015.
