15 16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 20	(c) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a unit may not revoke or suspend a license unless the unit first gives the licensee:
21 22	(i) written notice of the facts that warrant suspension or revocation; and

9	(II) INSTEAD OF ORDERING THE SUSPENSION OF THE LICENSE,
