$3 \\ 4 \\ 5 \\ 6 \\ 7 \\ 8 \\ 9$	FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Health Care Commission, in consultation with the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, certain experts, and interested stakeholders, to conduct a study of issues related to the incidence of uterine fibroids in the State; requiring the study to examine certain issues; requiring, on or before a certain date, the Commission to report certain findings to certain committees of the General Assembly; and generally relating to the Maryland Health Care Commission and a study of uterine fibroids.
10 11	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:
$12 \\ 13 \\ 14$	(a) The Maryland Health Care Commission, in consultation with the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, experts in uterine fibroids, and interested stakeholders, shall conduct a study of issues related to the incidence of uterine fibroids in the State.
15	(b) The study conducted under subsection (a) of this section shall examine:

18	(2) the types of treatments and procedures used to treat uterine fibroids;
$\frac{19}{20}$	(3) data on the number of women in the State who undergo a hysterectomy, myomectomy, or other type of treatment for uterine fibroids each year;
$\frac{21}{22}$	(4) alternative, innovative, and less invasive treatments and procedures that are available to treat uterine fibroids;

1 (5) whether there is a need for more research to study the cause and 2 treatment of uterine fibroids; and

3 (6) whether licensed physicians in the State are willing and able to perform 4 less invasive procedures to treat uterine fibroids.

5 (c) On or before June 30, 2016, the Maryland Health Care Commission shall 6 report, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the findings of the 7 study conducted under subsection (a) of this section to the Senate Education, Health, and 8 Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government Operations 9 Committee.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 11 1, 2015.
