4 FOR the purpose of altering certain provisions of law relating to the composting of yard 5 waste; requiring a certain person to ensure certain yard waste is recycled in a certain 6 manner beginning on a certain date; authorizing certain composting facilities and 7 anaerobic digestion facilities to be located at refuse disposal systems; requiring a 8 certain person to ensure certain food residuals are diverted from the solid waste 9 stream in a certain manner beginning on a certain date; requiring the Department 10 of the Environment to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; and 11 generally relating to composting and anaerobic digestion facilities.
