A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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St. Mary's County - Animal Regulations

- 3 FOR the purpose of repealing provisions authorizing the County Commissioners of St. 4 Mary's County to pass rules, regulations, or resolutions relating to dog licenses, the $\mathbf{5}$ prohibition of dogs running at large off the property of the owner, the seizure and 6 disposal of dogs found running at large, and the confinement of female dogs in heat; 7 repealing provisions authorizing the county commissioners to delegate, by written 8 contract, the enforcement of certain rules, regulations, or resolutions; authorizing 9 the county commissioners to enact a local law to provide a comprehensive system for the regulation, humane treatment, and keeping of domestic animals and wild 10 11 animals kept in captivity; authorizing a certain local law to include a schedule of 12fines for designated violations; providing that a violation of a certain local law is a civil infraction; and generally relating to the regulation of certain animals in St. 13 14Mary's County.
