- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article - Transportation

- 18 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person driving or otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave it unattended until the engine is stopped, the ignition locked, the key removed, and the brake effectively set.
- 21 (b) A person driving or otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave the 22 motor vehicle unattended until, if the vehicle is on a grade, the front wheels are turned to 23 the curb or side of the highway.



- (c) **(1)** When a cat or dog is left in the unattended vehicle of an on-duty law enforcement officer or an animal control officer, the provisions of subsection (a) of this section do not apply to the law enforcement officer or the animal control officer.
- (2) IN PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A PERSON WHO IS IN CHARGE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE THAT HAS RECENTLY HAD THE ENGINE STARTED USING A REMOTE KEYLESS IGNITION SYSTEM.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2015.
