6 school graduates; establishing certain purposes of the Program; requiring the
7 Maryland Higher Education Commission to administer the Program and perform
8 certain duties; establishing certain eligibility requirements for participation in the
9 Program; requiring certain actions from nonprofit organizations that receive
10 Program funding; requiring the Commission to submit a summary report on the
11 Program on or before certain dates; ~~requiring the Governor to make an appropriation~~
12 ~~in the State budget for the Commission for a certain purpose;~~ providing for the

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 INTERNAL REVENUE CODE.

12 (C) “PROGRAM” MEANS THE ~~LOW-INCOME STUDENT~~ MARYLAND HIGHER

20 GRADUATES TO ATTEND AND COMPLETE COLLEGE;

21 (2) CONNECT POTENTIAL COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY STUDENTS
22 WITH NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS THAT HAVE A HISTORY OF SUCCESSFUL HIGHER
23 EDUCATION OUTCOMES FOR TARGETED YOUTH;

24 (3) CREATE AN EQUAL MATCHING FUND FOR NONPROFIT
25 ORGANIZATIONS TO ACCESS IN ORDER TO INCREASE COLLEGE OUTREACH SERVICES
26 TO LOW-INCOME STUDENTS;

27 (4) PROVIDE FUNDING FOR NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE
28 ALREADY ESTABLISHED IN COMMUNITIES TO PROVIDE TARGETED OUTREACH TO
29 ENCOURAGE LOW-INCOME STUDENTS TO ENROLL IN COLLEGE; AND

1 **(5) ESTABLISH A 2-YEAR PILOT PROGRAM TO DETERMINE IF THE**
2 **PROGRAM CAN LEAD TO AN INCREASE IN LOW-INCOME STUDENTS ATTENDING AND**
3 **SUCCESSING IN COLLEGE.**

6 **(B) TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THE PROGRAM, THE COMMISSION**

8 **(1) ESTABLISH A GRANT PROGRAM TO BE PUBLISHED ON THE**
9 **COMMISSION'S WEB SITE THROUGH WHICH NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS MAY**
10 **LEARN ABOUT ELIGIBILITY, APPLICATION, AND COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS AND**
11 **APPLY FOR FUNDING AS PROVIDED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE;**

12 **(2) DEVELOP APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS AND REVIEW AND**
13 **APPROVE APPLICATIONS;**

14 **(3) DEVELOP A PROCESS FOR VERIFYING THAT MATCHING FUNDS**
15 **ARE AVAILABLE; AND**

16 **(4) ALLOCATE FUNDING TO APPROVED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS**
17 **ON A COMPETITIVE BASIS.**

19 **(A) TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM, A NONPROFIT**
20 **ORGANIZATION SHALL:**

21 **(1) BE LOCATED IN THE STATE;**

22 **(2) HAVE A CONTRACT OR MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH**
23 **A LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM OR AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION OR MUST**
24 **ESTABLISH ONE IF ONE DOES NOT EXIST; AND**

25 **(3) DEMONSTRATE AN EQUAL MATCH FOR FUNDS REQUESTED.**

26 **(B) A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT RECEIVES FUNDING THROUGH THE**
27 **PROGRAM SHALL:**

28 **(1) SUBMIT DATA ON OUTREACH PROGRAMS;**

1 **(2) TRACK STUDENT PROGRESS THROUGH THE HIGHER EDUCATION**
2 **SYSTEM; AND**

3 **(3) SUBMIT ANNUAL REPORTS TO THE COMMISSION ON OR BEFORE**
4 **OCTOBER 1 FOLLOWING THE FISCAL YEAR IN WHICH FUNDS WERE RECEIVED.**

6 **(A) THE COMMISSION SHALL PREPARE A REPORT ON THE PROGRAM THAT**
7 **INCLUDES:**

8 **(1) A SUMMARY OF THE REPORTS RECEIVED REGARDING THE**
9 **PROGRAM;**

10 **(2) THE AMOUNT OF FUNDS DISTRIBUTED EACH FISCAL YEAR; AND**

11 **(3) IF AN ELIGIBLE WAIT LIST EXISTS, THE NUMBER OF NONPROFIT**
12 **ORGANIZATIONS ON THE WAIT LIST.**

13 **(B) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2017, AND DECEMBER 1, 2018, THE**
14 **COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT A COPY OF THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER**
15 **SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE**
16 **WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.**

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
22 October 1, 2015. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of September
23 30, 2019, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
24 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
