A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Community Colleges – Victims of Human Trafficking – Exemption From 3 Out–of–County Fees

FOR the purpose of exempting certain victims of human trafficking from paying a certain out-of-county fee at community colleges in the State; authorizing each board of community college trustees to waive a certain out-of-county fee for certain students; requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission to adopt certain regulations; defining a certain term; and generally relating to an exemption from the out-of-county fees for victims of human trafficking.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Education

18 16–310.

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19 (b) (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2), (3), and (4) of this subsection 20 and subsection (g) of this section, any student who attends a community college not 21 supported by the county in which the student resides shall pay, in addition to the student 22 tuition and fees payable by a resident of a county that supports the community college, an 23 out–of–county or out–of–region fee at least equal to 60% of the county share per full–time 24 equivalent student as determined under § 16–305 of this subtitle.



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1 (2) (i) Any student who resides in an incorporated municipality whose 2 corporate limits extend into 2 counties in the State is considered an in-county resident for 3 tuition purposes at a community college campus located within that municipality that is 4 supported by either county.

5 (ii) If a student is considered an in-county resident under this 6 paragraph and the student does not reside in the county that supports the community 7 college, the county in which the student resides shall pay the difference between the 8 out-of-county tuition and the in-county tuition.

9 (3) Each board of community college trustees may waive the out-of-county 10 or out-of-region fee, as determined in paragraph (1) of this subsection, for a student who 11 is employed by a business located in the county that supports the community college.

12 (4) (i) In this paragraph, "BRAC" means the Base Realignment and 13 Closure process as announced by the United States Department of Defense.

14 (ii) Each board of community college trustees may waive the 15 out-of-county fee or out-of-region fee as determined in paragraph (1) of this subsection for 16 a student who resides in the county but does not meet the in-county residency requirement 17 for tuition purposes and has moved to the State as an employee or a family member of an 18 employee as part of BRAC.

19 (5) (I) IN THIS PARAGRAPH, "VICTIM OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING"
20 MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS BEEN RECRUITED, HARBORED, TRANSPORTED,
21 PROVIDED, OR OBTAINED FOR LABOR, SERVICES, OR A SEXUAL ACT THROUGH THE
22 USE OF FORCE, FRAUD, OR COERCION.

(II) EACH BOARD OF COMMUNITY COLLEGE TRUSTEES MAY
 WAIVE THE OUT-OF-COUNTY FEE AS DETERMINED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
 SUBSECTION FOR A STUDENT WHO ATTENDS THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND:

- 261.Is not a resident of the county; and
- 27 **2.** IS A VICTIM OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

28(III)1.THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO29IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS PARAGRAPH.

THE REGULATIONS SHALL INCLUDE A REQUIREMENT
 THAT AN APPLICATION FOR A WAIVER OF THE OUT-OF-COUNTY FEE AS PROVIDED
 IN THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL CONTAIN EVIDENCE THAT THE APPLICANT IS A VICTIM
 OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING, INCLUDING:

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1A.CERTIFIED LAW ENFORCEMENT, COURT, OR OTHER2FEDERAL OR STATE AGENCY RECORDS OR FILES;

3 **B. DOCUMENTATION FROM A HUMAN TRAFFICKING** 4 **PREVENTION OR ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; OR**

5 C. DOCUMENTATION FROM A RELIGIOUS, MEDICAL, OR 6 OTHER PROFESSIONAL FROM WHOM THE APPLICANT HAS SOUGHT ASSISTANCE OR 7 TREATMENT AS A VICTIM OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 9 1, 2015.
