A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Primary and Secondary Education – Health and Safety – Sugar–Free Schools Act

4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain county boards to develop a certain plan on or before a certain date for reducing certain students' total sugar intake per school meal based $\mathbf{5}$ 6 on certain recommendations; requiring certain county boards to convene a certain 7 workgroup to assist with the development of a certain plan; providing for the 8 membership of a certain workgroup; requiring the workgroup to make certain recommendations; requiring a certain workgroup to hold a certain amount of public 9 10 hearings and provide a certain opportunity for public testimony; and generally 11 relating to the Sugar–Free Schools Act.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
