A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Health General – Birth Certificates – Issuance of Copies**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the issuance of a certified or an abridged copy of a birth
4 certificate to an adult child of the individual to whom the record relates; and
5 generally relating to the issuance of copies of birth certificates.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Health – General**

14 4–217.

15 (b) (1) A certified or abridged copy of a birth certificate may be issued only:

16 (i) On order of a court of competent jurisdiction;

17 (ii) On request of the individual to whom the record relates;

18 (iii) On request of a parent, guardian, surviving spouse, **ADULT**
19 **CHILD**, or other authorized representative of the individual; or

20 (iv) In accordance with Title 5, Subtitle 3A or Subtitle 4B of the
21 Family Law Article.

1 (2) A certified or abridged copy of a birth certificate may contain only the
2 personal information that appears on the birth certificate and may not include any
3 confidential medical information that appears on the birth certificate.

4 (3) Birth certificate information may not be given if it is to be used for
5 commercial solicitation or private gain.

6 (4) A noncertified copy of a birth certificate including confidential medical
7 information may be provided to a unit of the Department to carry out its legal mandate or
8 to conduct Institutional Review Board (IRB) approved research or study. Any report
9 resulting from this research or study may not contain personal identifiers unless authorized
10 by the subject of the record or the subject's parent or authorized representative.

11 (5) A copy of a birth certificate may be given to the Maryland Immunization
12 Program to improve childhood immunization rates.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
14 October 1, 2015.
