A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Election Law - Early Voting Centers and Polling Places - Waiting Times to Vote

3 FOR the purpose of stating the intent of the General Assembly that no voter should have 4 to wait more than a certain period of time to vote at an early voting center or polling 5 place; stating the intent of the General Assembly that the State Board of Elections 6 and local boards of elections take every possible action to ensure that voters casting 7 ballots at early voting centers and polling places are able to complete the entire 8 voting process within a certain period of time; requiring the State Board to adopt a 9 comprehensive plan to accomplish the goal that all voters at early voting centers and polling places be able to vote within a certain period of time; requiring the 10 11 comprehensive plan to be adopted on or before a certain date and include certain 12 elements; requiring the State Board to submit the comprehensive plan to certain 13 committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; requiring the State 14 Board to analyze certain data, make the data available to the public, and submit a 15 summary report of the data to certain committees of the General Assembly on or 16 before certain dates; requiring the State Board to utilize certain data to revise the 17 comprehensive plan, issue an updated plan, and submit the updated plan to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before certain dates; and generally 18 19 relating to waiting times to vote at early voting centers and polling places.

25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 26

- 2 (A) IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT:
- 3 (1) NO VOTER SHOULD HAVE TO WAIT MORE THAN **30** MINUTES TO 4 VOTE AT AN EARLY VOTING CENTER OR POLLING PLACE; AND
- 5 (2) THE STATE BOARD AND LOCAL BOARDS TAKE EVERY POSSIBLE
- 6 ACTION TO ENSURE THAT VOTERS CASTING BALLOTS AT EARLY VOTING CENTERS
- 7 AND POLLING PLACES ARE ABLE TO COMPLETE THE ENTIRE VOTING PROCESS,
- 8 FROM ARRIVAL TO DEPARTURE, WITHIN 30 MINUTES.
- 9 (B) TO ACCOMPLISH THE GOAL IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, THE
- 10 STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, ON OR BEFORE JULY 1,

- 21 THE PUBLIC ON THE INTERNET CONCERNING VOTER WAIT TIMES AT:
- 22 (I) EACH EARLY VOTING CENTER; AND
- 23 (II) POLLING PLACES WITH A HISTORY OF EXCESSIVE WAIT
- 24 TIMES, SELECTED BY THE STATE BOARD;
- 25 (3) EVALUATION OF THE LAYOUT OF POLLING PLACES TO MAXIMIZE
- 26 EFFICIENCY AND MINIMIZE WAIT TIMES;
- 27 (4) ESTIMATION OF VOTER TURNOUT FOR AN ELECTION, INCLUDING
- 28 THE TIMES AND LOCATIONS THAT VOTERS ARE LIKELY TO VOTE;

- 1 (5) TESTING OF THE LENGTH OF TIME IT TAKES A VOTER TO VOTE THE 2 BALLOT THAT WILL BE USED IN AN ELECTION;
- 3 (6) USE OF ELECTION JUDGES TO:
- 4 (I) GREET VOTERS AS THE VOTERS ARRIVE AT AN EARLY
- 5 VOTING CENTER OR POLLING PLACE AND PROVIDE APPROPRIATE DIRECTION OR
- 6 ASSISTANCE TO THE VOTERS; AND
- 7 (II) COLLECT DATA ON THE NUMBER OF POTENTIAL VOTERS
- 8 WHO LEAVE AN EARLY VOTING CENTER OR ELECTION DAY POLLING PLACE WITHOUT
- 9 VOTING BECAUSE THE WAIT TIME IS TOO LONG;
- 10 (7) APPROPRIATE ACCOMMODATIONS FOR VOTERS WITH
- 11 DISABILITIES, INCLUDING ALLOWING A VOTER WITH A DISABILITY TO MOVE TO THE
- 12 FRONT OF ANY WAITING LINE AT THE REQUEST OF THE VOTER; AND
- 13 (8) VOTER EDUCATION TO INCREASE VOTER PREPAREDNESS AND
- 14 REDUCE THE LENGTH OF TIME REQUIRED FOR INDIVIDUAL VOTERS TO VOTE.
- 15 (C) THE STATE BOARD SHALL SUBMIT THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN
- 16 REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2016,
- 17 TO THE SENATE EDUCATION, HEALTH, AND ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS

- 4 (3) SUBMIT THE UPDATED COMPREHENSIVE PLAN ON OR BEFORE JULY 1 OF EACH YEAR IN WHICH A REGULARLY SCHEDULED GENERAL ELECTION IS HELD TO THE SENATE EDUCATION, HEALTH, AND ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS IN ACCORDANCE
