13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17	(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
18 19	(2) "LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 3–101 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE.
20 21	(3) "Local official" means an individual serving in a publicly elected office of a local government unit, as defined in § 10–101 of the State Government Article.

3 4	(ii) "State official" includes the Governor, Governor–elect, Lieutenant Governor, and Lieutenant Governor–elect.

6	(i) an oral threat; or
7 8 9	(ii) a threat in any written form, whether or not the writing is signed, or if the writing is signed, whether or not it is signed with a fictitious name or any other mark.
10 11	(b) A person may not knowingly and willfully make a threat to take the life of, kidnap, or cause physical injury to:
12	(1) a State official[,];
13	(2) a local official[,];
14	(3) a deputy State's Attorney[,];
15	(4) an assistant State's Attorney[, or];
16	(5) an assistant Public Defender; OR
17	(6) A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.
18 19	(c) A person may not knowingly send, deliver, part with, or make for the purpose of sending or delivering a threat prohibited under subsection (b) of this section.
20 21	(d) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 3 years or a fine not exceeding \$2,500 or both.
22 23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
