A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **General Provisions – Commemorative Days – Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans**
3 **Day**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing a certain day as Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day in
5 recognition of the service and sacrifice of Vietnam veterans; making this Act an
6 emergency measure; and generally relating to Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans
7 Day.

19 Preamble

20 WHEREAS, The Vietnam War was fought in Vietnam from 1961 to 1975, and
21 involved North Vietnam and the Viet Cong in conflict with United States armed forces,
22 allies of the United States, and South Vietnam; and

23 WHEREAS, In 1965, more than 129,000 members of the United States armed forces
24 were serving in Vietnam, reaching a peak of approximately 543,000 by 1969; and

1 WHEREAS, On January 27, 1973, an agreement was reached to end the war and, on
2 March 30, 1973, the United States armed forces completed its withdrawal of combat troops;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, More than 58,000 members of the United States armed forces, including
5 1,014 from the State of Maryland, lost their lives in Vietnam and more than 300,000
6 members were wounded; and

7 WHEREAS, Members of the United States armed forces who served bravely and
8 faithfully for the United States during the Vietnam War were caught on their return home
9 in the crossfire of an extremely divisive public debate about the involvement of the United
10 States in the Vietnam War, which deprived many of those members of public support and
11 appreciation of their patriotic service; and

12 WHEREAS, In 1982, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial was dedicated in the District
13 of Columbia to commemorate those members of the United States armed forces who died
14 or were declared missing-in-action in the Vietnam War; and

15 WHEREAS, The designation of a “Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day” is an
16 appropriate way for the State to thank and honor its members of the United States armed
17 forces for their service and sacrifice during the Vietnam War; now, therefore,

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That Section(s) 7-402 through 7-413, respectively, of Article – General Provisions of the
20 Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7-403 through 7-414,
21 respectively.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read
23 as follows:

24 **Article – General Provisions**

25 **7-402.**

26 **MARCH 30 SHALL BE WELCOME HOME VIETNAM VETERANS DAY IN**
27 **RECOGNITION OF THE SERVICE AND SACRIFICE OF VIETNAM VETERANS.**

28 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
29 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
30 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
31 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
32 enacted.
