1 (II) A FINANCIALLY DEPENDENT CHILD OF AN ACTIVE DUTY OR 2 RETIRED MEMBER OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES.

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- [(c)] (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article, [a spouse or financially dependent child of an active duty member] AN INDIVIDUAL DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION who enrolls as an entering student in a public institution of higher education [and] IN THE STATE is exempt from paying nonresident tuition [under subsection (b) of this section shall continue to be exempt from paying nonresident tuition] AT A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE STATE if:
- [(1)] (I) The active duty [member no longer meets the requirements of subsection (b)(1) of this section] OR RETIRED MEMBER WAS STATIONED IN THE STATE AT ANY TIME; and
- [(2)] (II) The spouse or financially dependent child [remains continuously enrolled at the public institution of higher education] ATTENDED A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SCHOOL IN THE STATE AT ANY TIME DURING THE 4 YEARS IMMEDIATELY BEFORE ENROLLING IN A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE STATE.
- 17 **[**(d)**] (C)** The Commission shall adopt regulations in accordance with Title 10, 18 Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article to implement the provisions of this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
